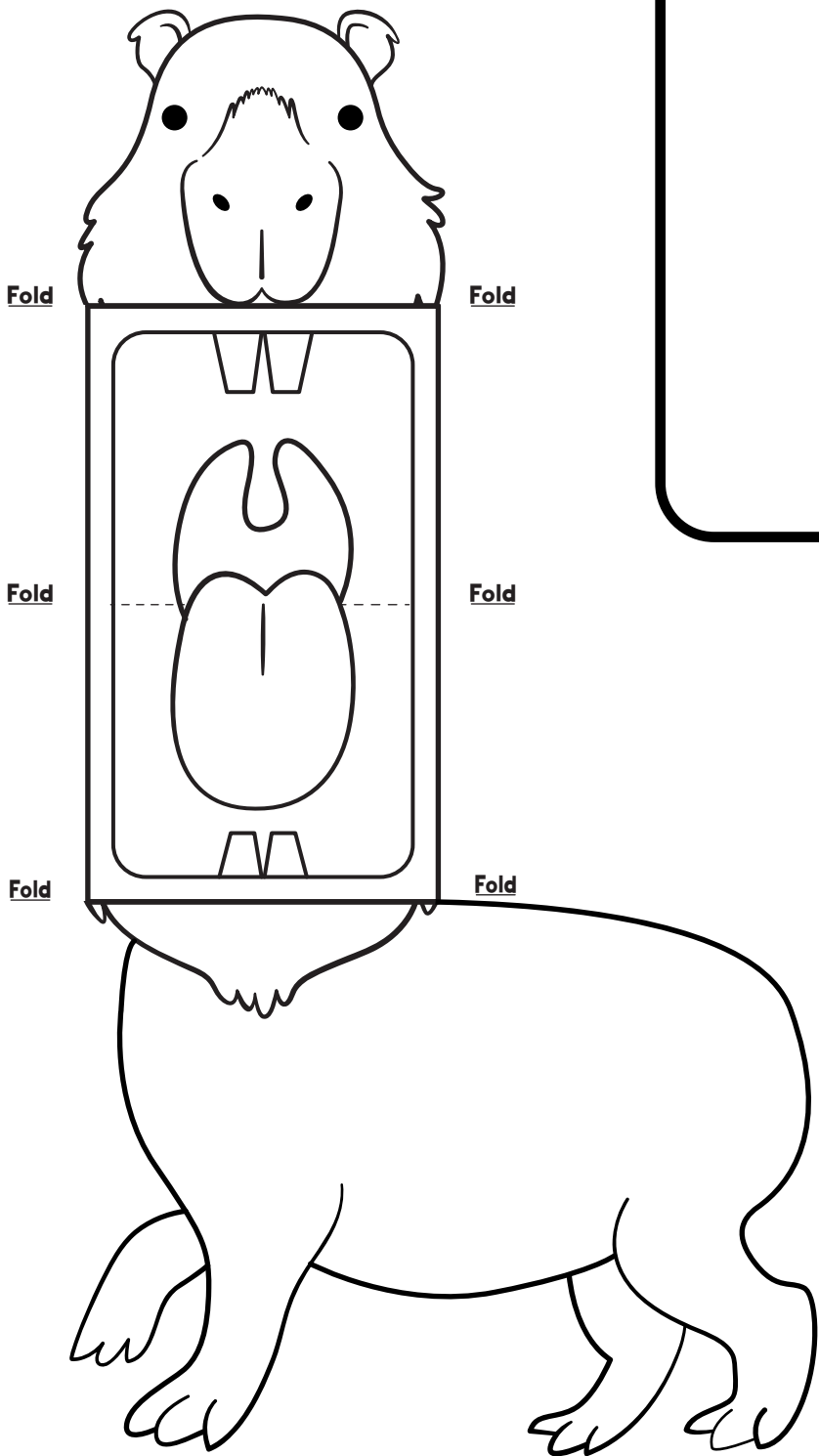


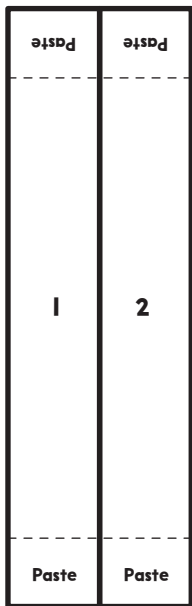
# Capybara

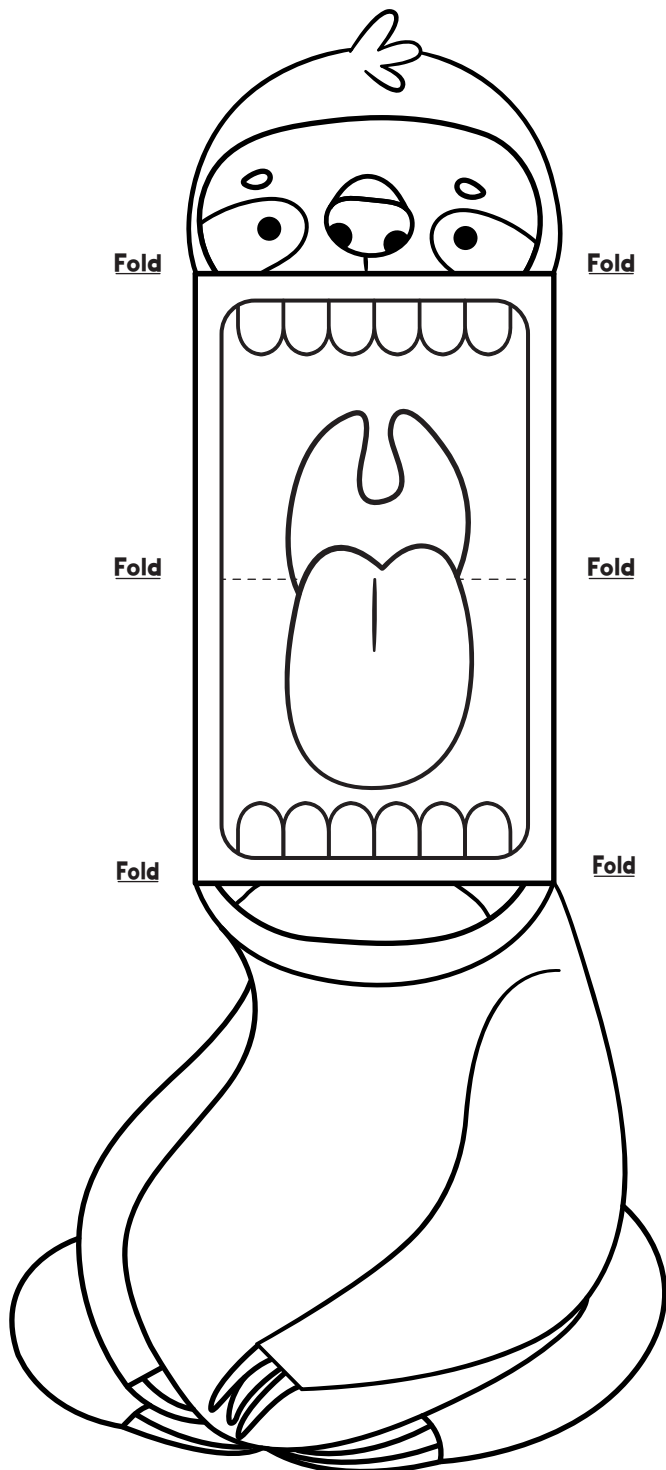

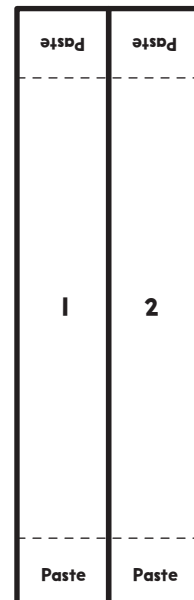
# Sloth

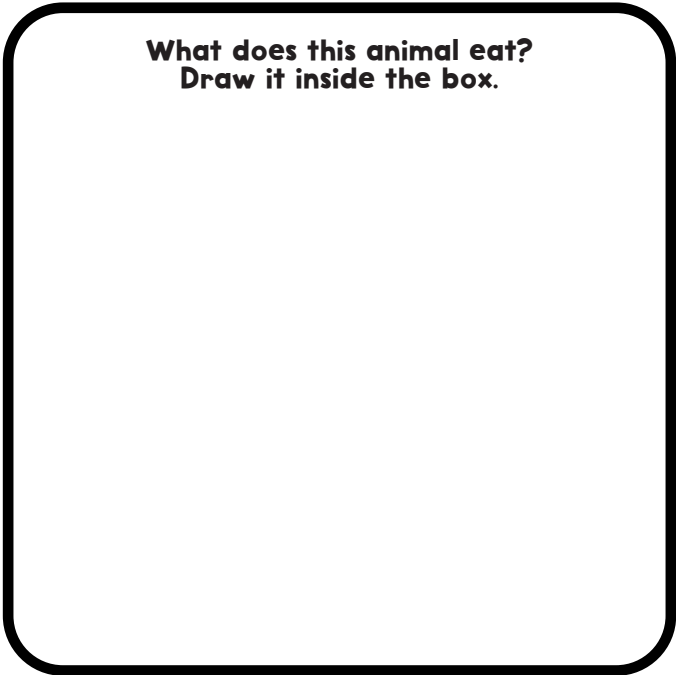
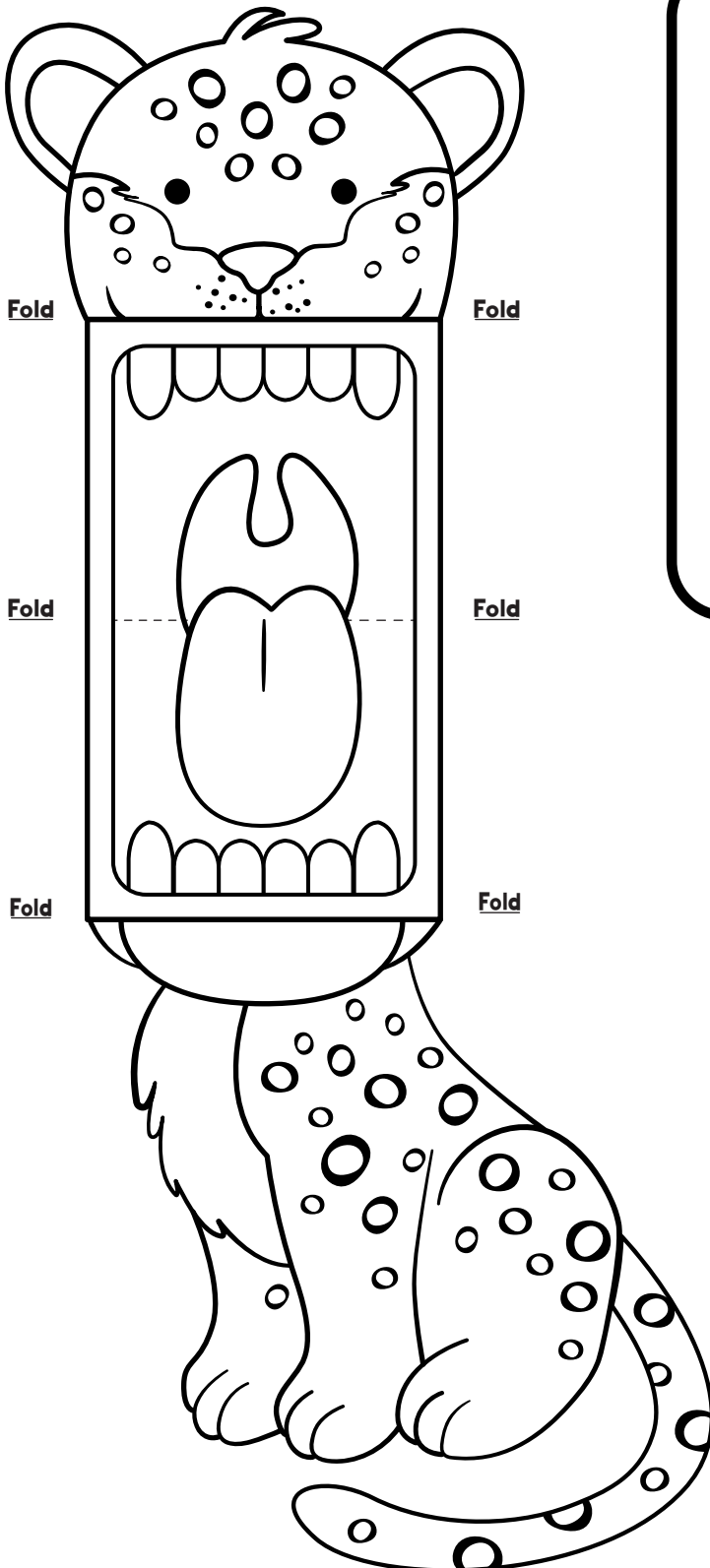

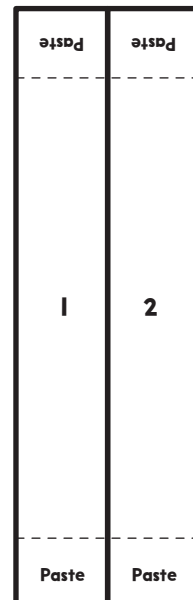
# Leopard

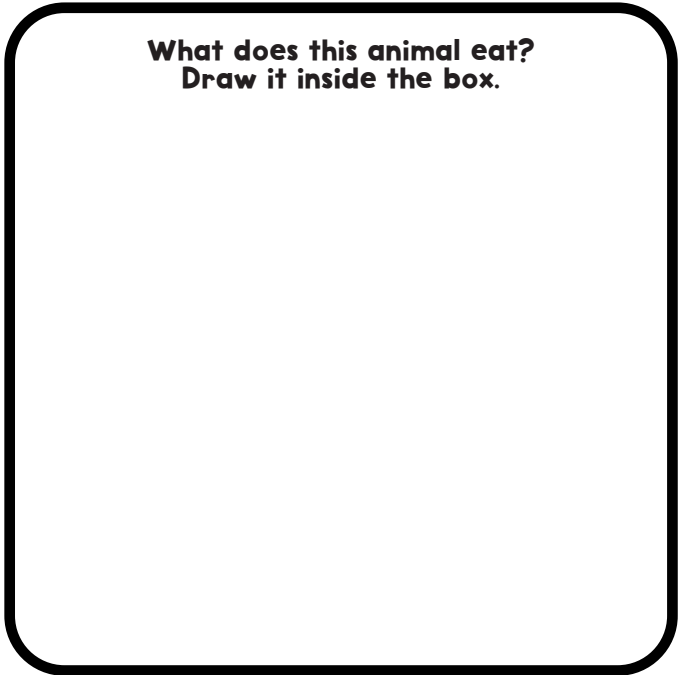
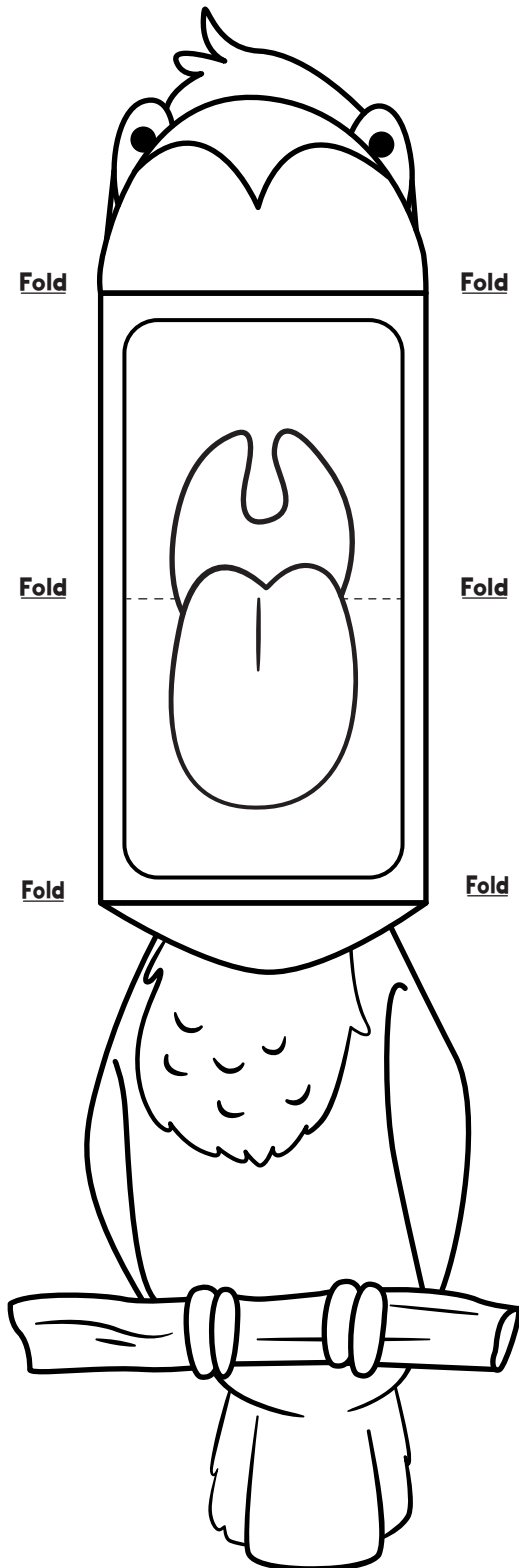

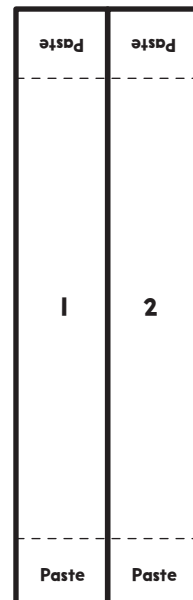


# Toucan

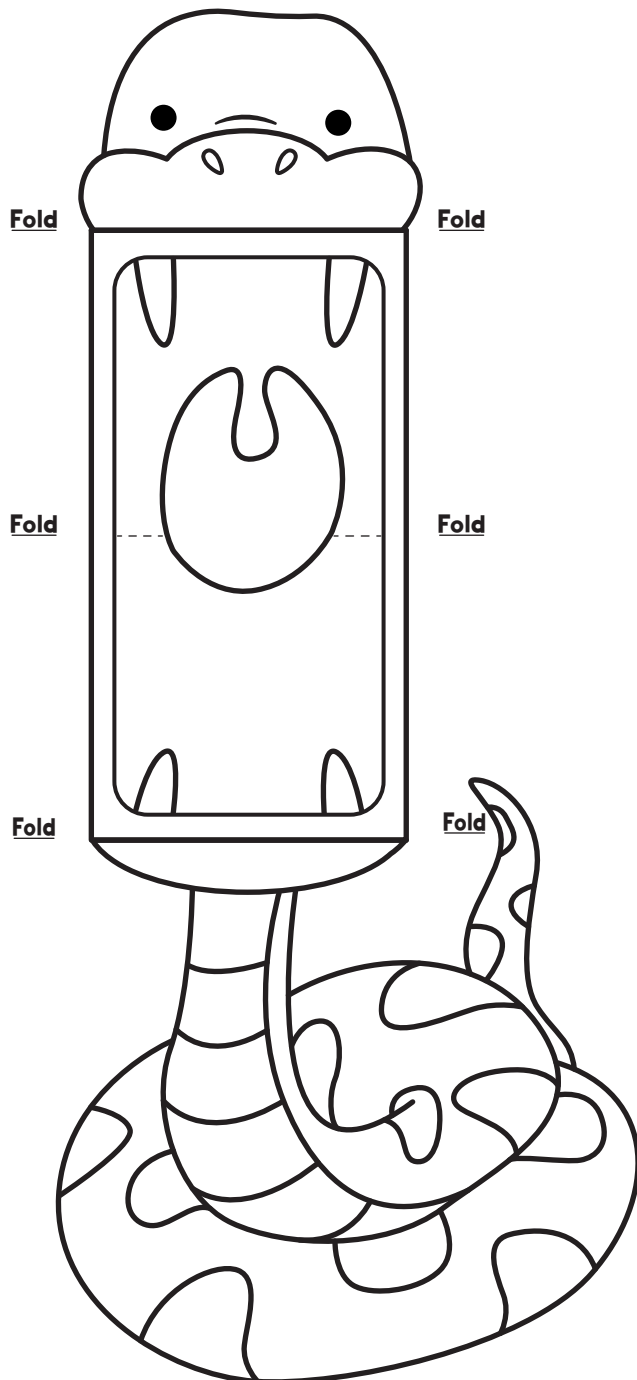

# Snake

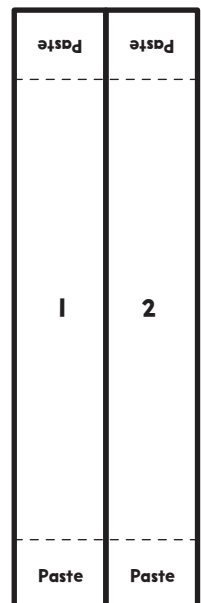
Snakes are elongated limbless carnivorous reptiles of the suborder Serpentes. Like all other squamates snakes are ectothermic amniote vertebrates covered in overlapping scales. There are many different types of venomous snakes that live in rainforest areas. Mambas coral snakes cobras and vipers are all venomous rainforest snakes. These snakes inject their venom into their prey using very sharp fangs. In many cases these snakes can be dangerous and even deadly to humans.

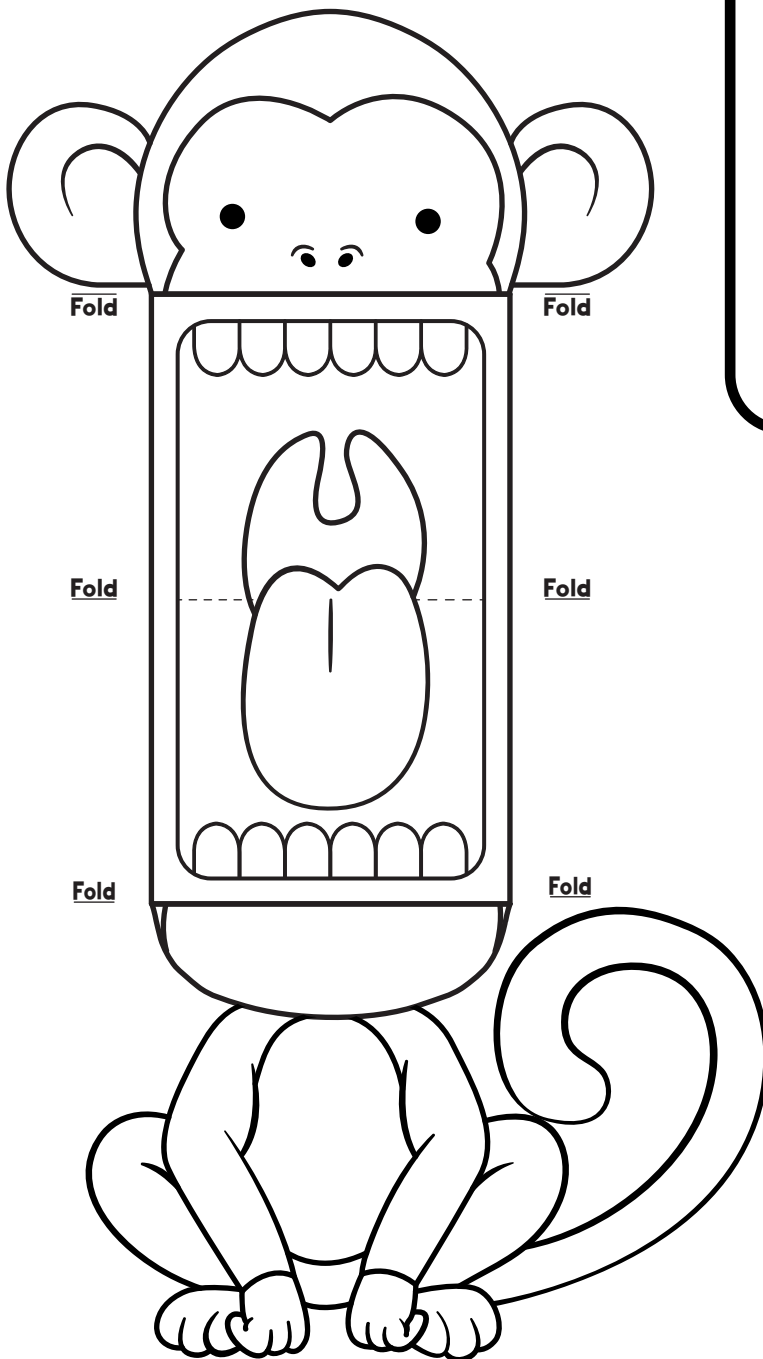

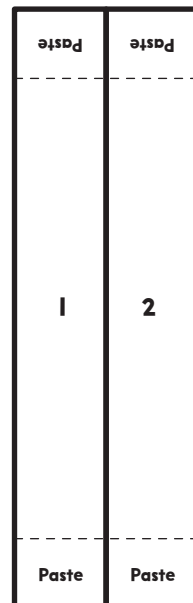
# Monkey

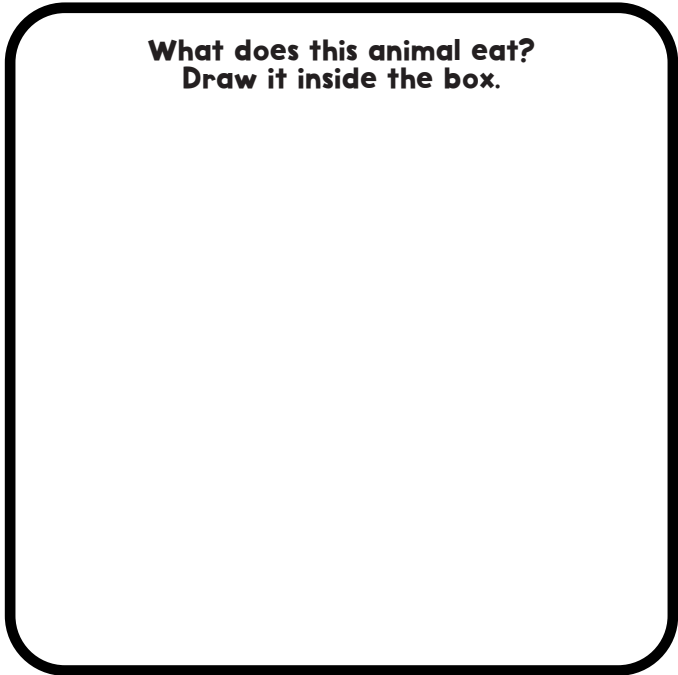
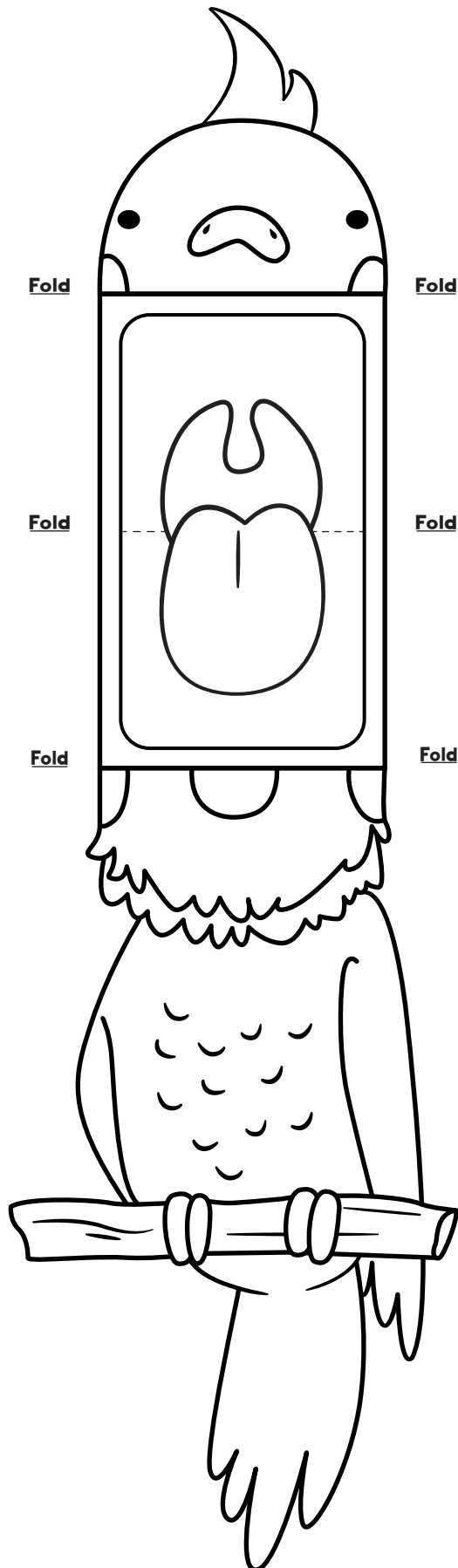

# Cockatiel

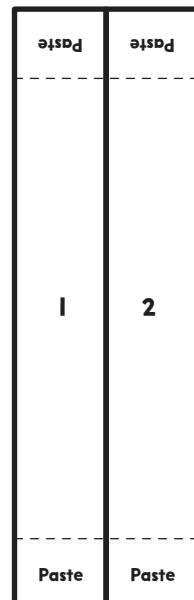
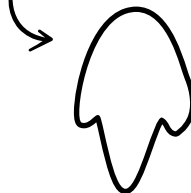
The cockatiel also known as the weero weiro or quarrion is a medium sized parrot that is a member of its own branch of the cockatoo family endemic to Australia.

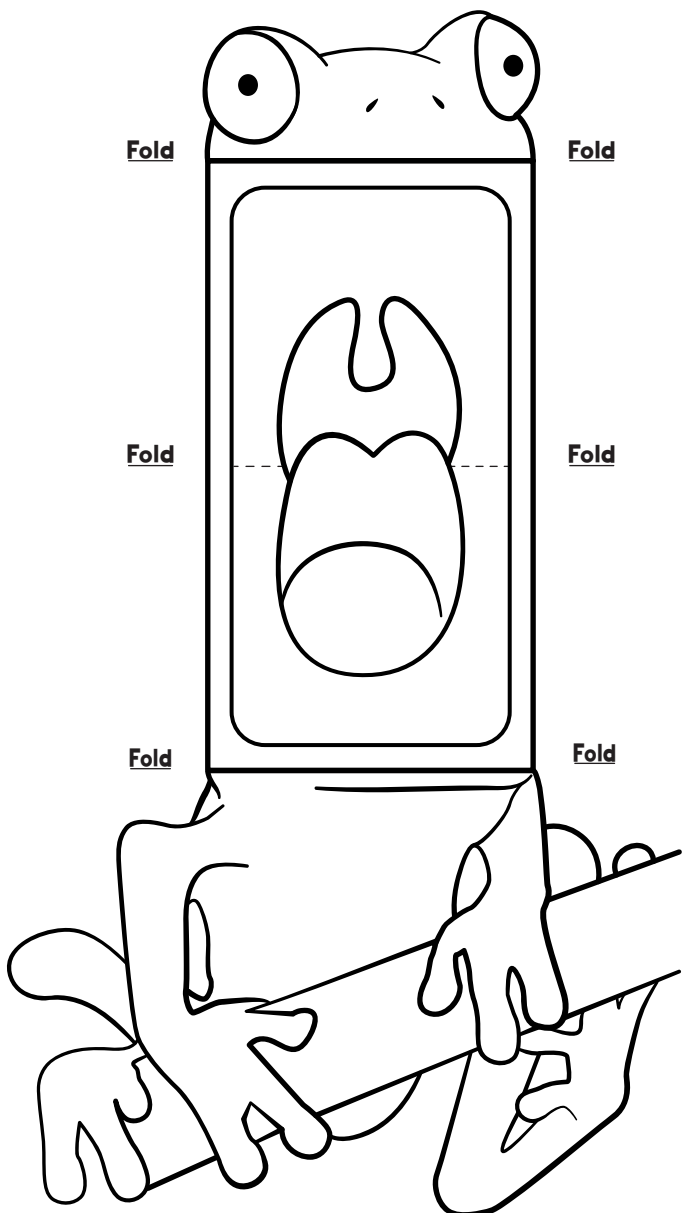
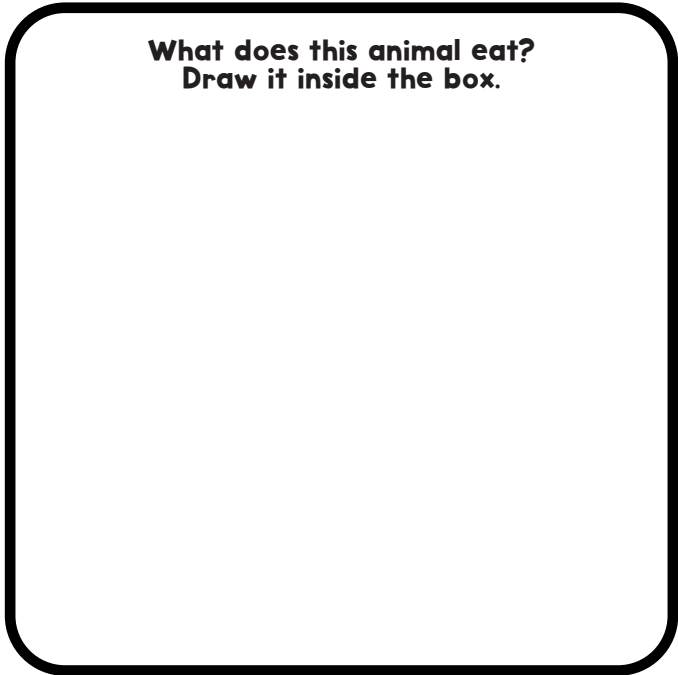

Attach the beak of the cockatiel to its head.

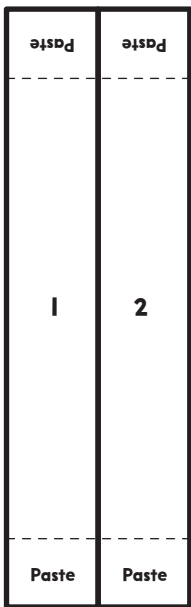


# Poison Dart Frog

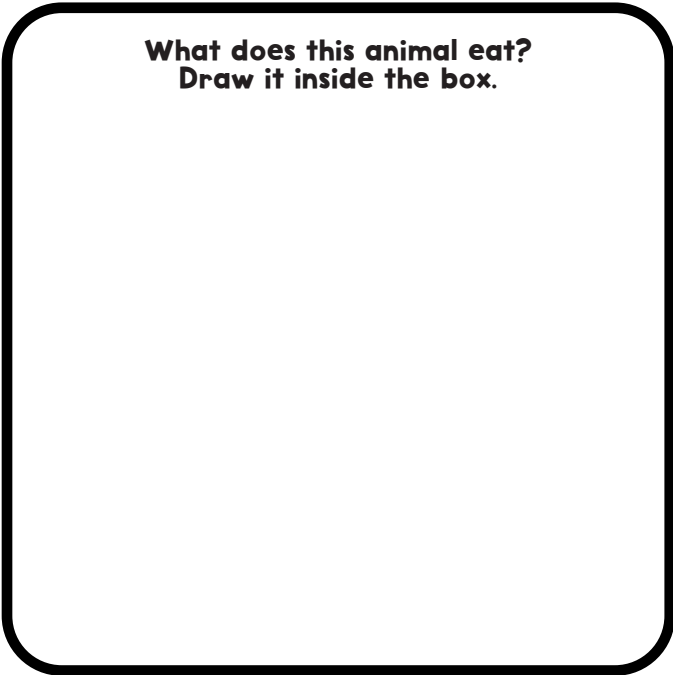
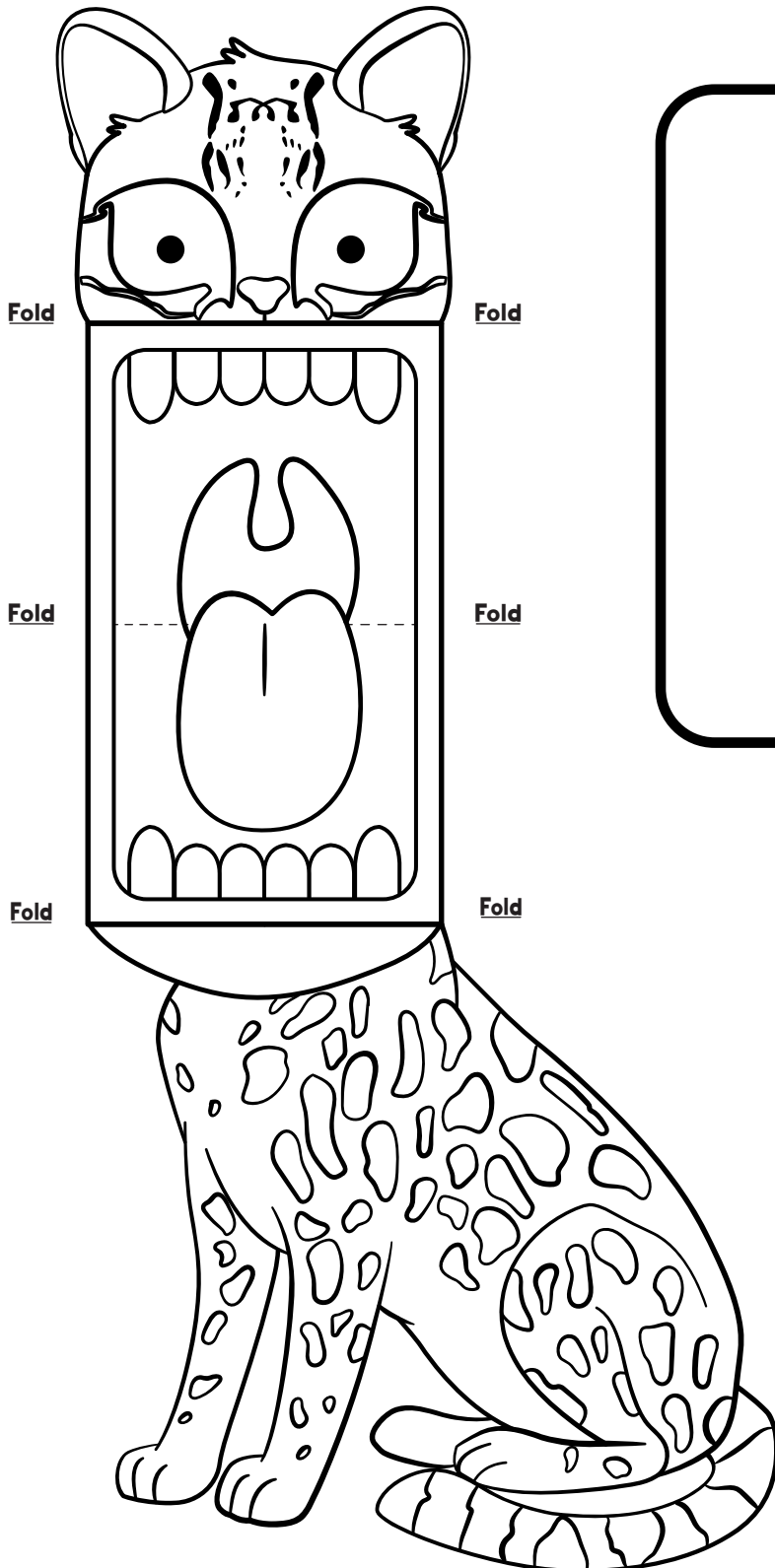

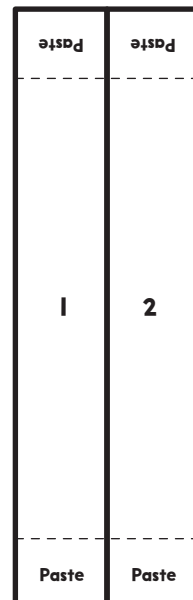
# Ocelot

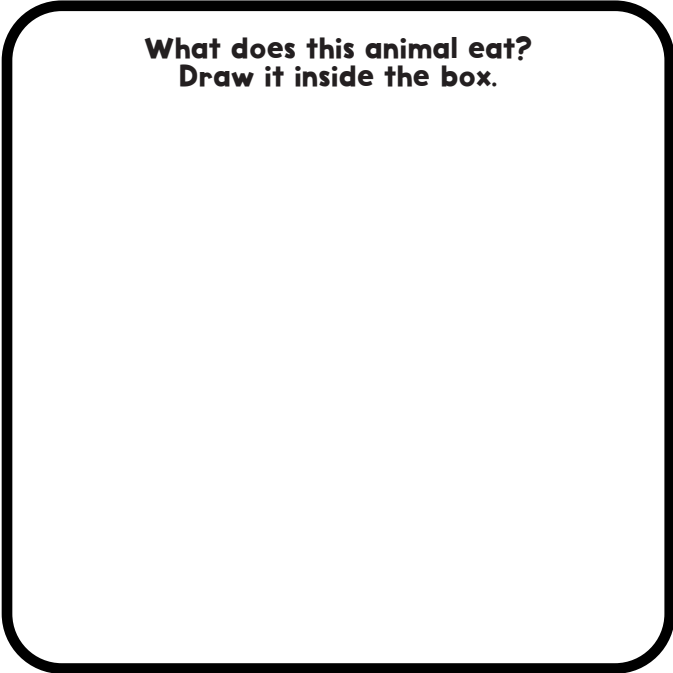
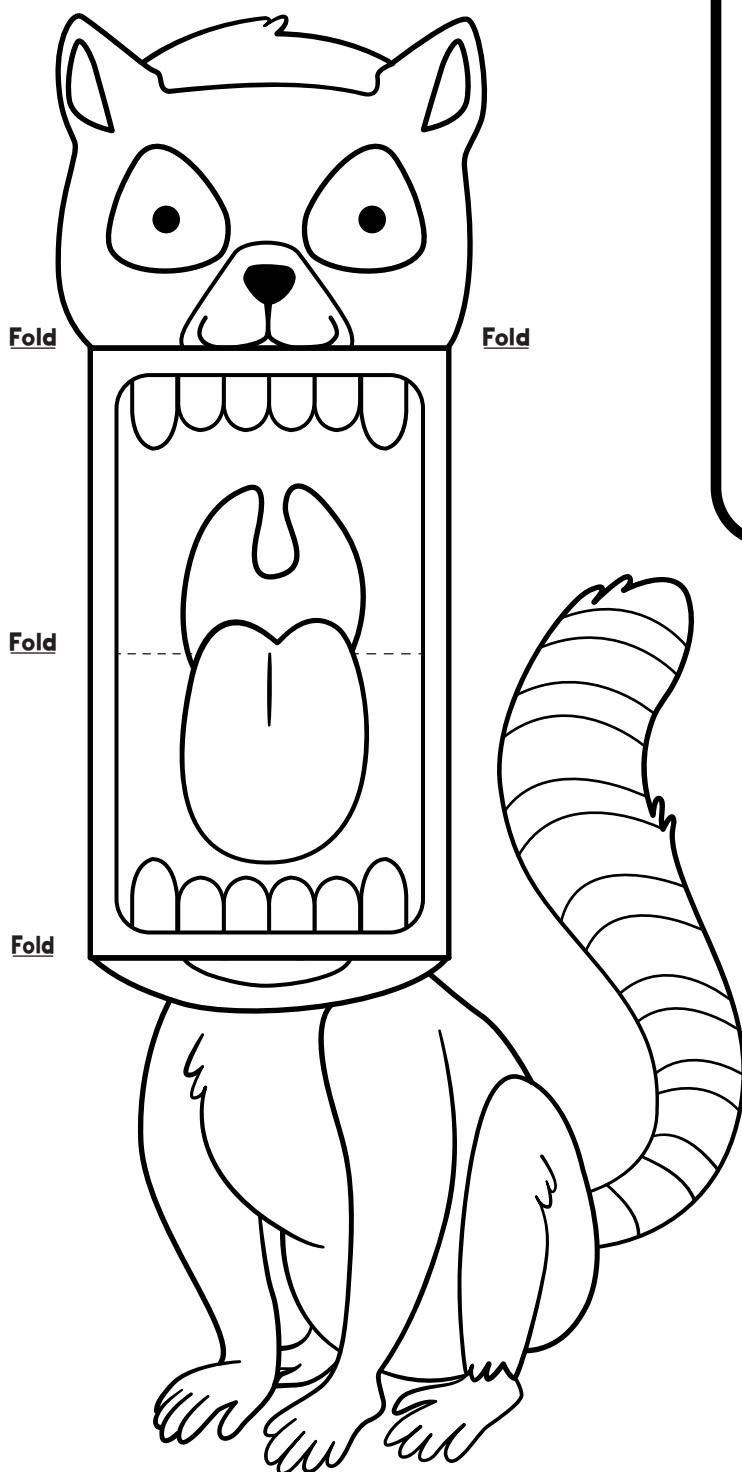
